Copyright Ownership and Efficient Exploitation: An Empirical Study of American Works Before and After They Enter the Public Domain.

Abstract:

This study identifies popular books and music from 1913-1933 and analyzes the availability and exploitation of these works during the years immediately before and after they fall into the public domain. Contrary to the assertion of some economists, the absence of property rights seems to lead to more efficient exploitation.
